A quick lesson in QR codes. QR codes look like this: Simply turn your smartphone camera on and focus it on the QR code. When promoted, click on the link that pops up and it will take you to the linked article.



One topic I wish I could elaborate on is the **High Pathogenic Avian Influenza**. Two snow geese with

HPAI were found in Henderson County. HPAI can be
found in many wild birds and poultry. If you have
chickens, be on the lookout for symptoms, limit traffic to
and around your coop and keep wild birds out if possible.

Another topic for discussion is **beekeeping**. The EPA recently released an advisory to clarify which pesticides beekeepers can use to control varroa mites in their hives. If you are a beekeeper and are treating for varroa mites, please read the article provided by the UK entomologist by accessing the QR code provided. Remember, the label is the law and don't shoot the messenger! haha



Yet another hot topic is the **KY cattle EID tag regulations** currently being debated. My understanding is that this topic is fluid and the news will likely change while this newsletter is in the mail. Therefore, I just wanted to make sure you all are aware of the topic and hopefully have time to research and decide your stance on this controversial topic. Again, don't shoot the messenger!



# Recipe of the Month

# **BBQ Venison Meatballs**

### Ingredients:

### **Meatballs**

1 pound ground venison (may substitute elk or beef)

½ cup 2% milk

34 cup rolled oats

½ cup minced fresh onion

¼ teaspoon salt

¼ teaspoon black pepper

### Sauce

\*1 cup ketchup

\*½ cup water

\*½ cup grated onion

\*2 tablespoons vinegar

\*1/4 cup brown sugar

\*1/4 teaspoon black pepper

### **Directions:**

Combine venison, milk, oats, onion, salt, and pepper in a large bowl. Use a sturdy spoon or clean hands to mix well. Shape meat mixture into 12 1-inch balls, and place in a shallow 9-by-13-inch baking pan.

\*Combine all the sauce ingredients in a bowl and stir well. Pour sauce over meatballs. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees F for 1 hour, turning over twice.

Yield: 10, 1-cup servings
